After a two-year hiatus due to Covid, the Hilton Apple Fest will be held on October 1st and October 2nd this year. The festival is held on the Hilton Community Center grounds at 59 Henry Street from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Sunday.

Local farmers will have apples, cider and produce for sale.

Over 70 crafters will be selling handmade products while local not-for-profit groups sell food at their own booths. There will be lots of free entertainment on the grounds during both days. Kids of all ages will enjoy Kids Korner. The Apple Pie Contest is Saturday morning, and our famous Apple Crisp is available at 12 p.m. both days. Parking is free at the Hilton Firemen's field and at the Hilton High School with free shuttle bus service from both locations to the festival.

Automated Meters

The Village of Hilton has begun the process of changing over our water meters to automated water meters. These automated water meters will eventually eliminate the water meter reading cards, but for now only those that have been changed out will not receive the meter cards. Those meters will now be read by a Village employee from the road. The process was started in the northwest portion of the Village. We will not move on to another section of the Village until this section is completed. We are still waiting for residents to call and schedule their meter change out appointments. If you received a letter from the Village or live in the Peach Blossom tract, Rolling Meadow tract, Tallwood tract, Dunbar Road (Village only), Carter Drive, Newcomb Drive, Green Lane, Cross Lane, or Albano Drive and have not scheduled your change out appointment, please call the office at 392-4144 as soon as possible.

DPW News



- **WINTER IS COMING**

If there is a fire hydrant near your house, please do your part to keep it accessible this winter. Reminder, there is no street parking during the months of November through April. The DPW will soon be plowing village streets and sidewalks. Please be considerate when parking your automobile in the driveway. Keep all vehicles clear of the entire sidewalk. The sidewalk plow cannot plow where vehicles are parked. Children who walk to school depend on clean sidewalks. Also, for the safety of your children, please prohibit children from playing on roadside snowbanks and making tunnels in snow piles left in cul-de-sacs. Children are hidden from the view of snow and sidewalk plow operators and other motorists. Children waiting for the school bus should stay clear of the sidewalk plow during sidewalk plowing operations. As a reminder, plowing, shoveling or blowing snow into the street is illegal and dangerous! Snow piles compromise both driver and pedestrian safety. Please alert hired contractors to this law - it applies to everyone!

- **DRIVEWAY REPLACEMENT**

If you plan to have your driveway paved, you should notify the Village Office at 392-4144 on or before April 1st of the same year that the work will be done. A Village representative will inspect the sidewalks and gutters by the driveway and make a determination if any repairs are needed. Scheduling for sidewalk or gutter repair work takes place early in the season and will not be done after April 1st. After the inspection, replacement work, if needed, can be done in advance of paving and will save the new driveway from any damage.

- **CONCRETE BOX/DIRT BOX**

The DPW has 2 concrete/dirt boxes for residential rental use. Please call ahead to reserve. We rent these out on a first come/first serve basis and the rental cost is \$10. A resident may keep the box for up to 5 days. If needed longer than the allotted time, an additional \$10 fee will be charged, and you may have to be placed back on the waiting list if one is not available. If needed to be emptied and brought back during your allotted time, an additional \$10 fee will be charged.

- **DUMPSTERS**

We rent out dumpsters to Village residents only. Dumpsters are delivered on Friday and picked up from your residence on Wednesday, unless the delivery/pickup day falls on a holiday. Please refer to the holiday schedule.

Size & Rental fee:

6 yd - \$135 9 yd - \$160 10 yd - \$170

There will be an additional cost for roofing materials, keeping an extra week or if it is emptied & left prior to pick up day. Please call the Village Office at 585-392-4144 to reserve a dumpster.

- **RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES:**

NEVER PLACE RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES IN THE TRASH OR RECYCLING.

Batteries can become crushed and explode when placed in the trash/recycling trucks, causing serious injuries to the workers.

The Monroe County/Waste Management Ecopark accepts rechargeable batteries from residents only. No appointment is needed during regular business hours:

- Wednesday: 1:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.
- Saturday from 7:30 a.m – 1:00 p.m.



FALL LEAF COLLECTION



Monday, October 17th - Friday, December 9th

Do NOT bag leaves. Place leaves in loose piles as close to the gutters as possible and at the tree lawn area.

Do NOT rake leaves into the street. DPW crews work hard to keep gutters free of debris. Please keep leaves out of gutters and storm drains along the sides of the road. Leaves in the gutter block storm drains and inhibit water drainage. This results in flooded streets and creates extra clean-up work for crews.

BRUSH COLLECTION

BRUSH SCHEDULE:

Pick up is the 1st & 3rd Friday of each month if you live NORTH of West/East Ave.

Pick up is the 2nd & 4th Friday of each month if you live SOUTH of West/East Ave.

- **Do NOT place brush into bags or containers.**
- **Brush does not have to be cut down into smaller pieces.**
- **Please keep branches/limbs as long as possible.**
- **Place brush in the tree lawn area, with butt ends going with the flow of traffic.**

******If you have a private contractor cutting or removing a tree(s) at your residence, it is the responsibility of the contractor to haul away all tree debris. The Village of Hilton will NOT clean up from contractors.**

REFUSE & STICKERS



REFUSE:

Please have ALL trash out for pick up no later than 7 a.m. on the day of your pickup (please refer to the holiday schedule).

Do NOT put trash out prior to your pick up day.

Carts - You may purchase a 96 gallon trash cart from the Village of Hilton for \$60 or you can use up to 3 – 32 gallon trash bins of your own. Any trash that exceeds the 96-gallon cart (or the 3 – 32 gallon trash bins) will require an additional cost. We will bill you for the additional amount of refuse, or you may purchase stickers at the Village Office.

STICKERS:

- **Red Stickers – Extra bag/container \$1 each**
- **Green Stickers – Bulk items \$5 each**
- **Light Green Stickers – Bulk Refrigerant items \$12 each**

METAL/APPLIANCES:

Pick up on Fridays

There is no additional charge for metal pick up unless it has refrigerant/freon in it.

EX: A/C, refrigerator, dehumidifier, freezer, etc. Each item will require a \$12 sticker.

YARD WASTE



We have added an extra date for Yard Waste pick up.

****Friday October 28th****

No Plastic or Paper Bags. No Cardboard Boxes. Metal or Plastic containers are acceptable. Loose material raked to the curb will not be picked up.

RECYCLING



There is no limit on recycling and we encourage everyone to recycle. Please have ALL your recycling out by 7 a.m. on your scheduled pickup day.

Do NOT place items out for pick up prior to your pickup day.

Cardboard must be broken or cut down to a 2' X 2' square and stacked.

Do NOT put cardboard or other recycling into an empty cardboard box.

RV-BOAT STORAGE



Village of Hilton Zoning Regulations

§ 275-9 Provisions applicable to all Zoning Districts.

C. Storage of vehicles, campers, RV trailers and boats. Motor vehicles, trailers, campers or boats and other recreational vehicles may be stored on a lot outside, if the following conditions are met:

- (1) They are behind the front plane of the principal dwelling and within the side and rear setbacks applicable to said lot, with the exception of April 1 through November 1, when they may be in a front area driveway of any residential or business lot.
- (2) At no time can recreational vehicles, trailers or boats be parked or stored in the driveway that would be closer than 15 feet distant from the nearest street, curb or edge of pavement.
- (3) A maximum of one ancillary vehicle, recreational vehicle or boat may be stored outside on any residential lot.
- (4) The vehicle must be owned by a full-time resident of the property.
- (5) Recreational vehicles shall not have fixed connections to electricity, water, gas or sanitary facilities, nor shall recreational vehicles at any time be used for living or housekeeping purposes while on the premises.
- (6) Any such recreational vehicle shall be kept in good repair and in working condition, with current license plate and/or registration, unless stored within a garage.

On August 27th, I had the pleasure of attending Hilton - Parma's Recreation Department Senior Citizen "Presenting with Pizza" in the Ingham Room at 10:30am. The presenter was Steve Sasson, a Parma resident. Steve, a retired Kodak engineer, is the internationally acclaimed inventor of the digital camera. I had heard his program once before around 2018 when he addressed the Parma Hilton Historical Society annual banquet. Sasson's usual presentations occur world-wide in cities like Brussels, London and Paris. He is a very "down-to-earth" guy with a great sense of humor, and he told me that he likes to address the hometown folks as many of them worked at Kodak at one time and the Elmgrove Plant was the areawhere the digital camera was first conceived around 1976. His program starts at the beginning when he was just a junior engineer. He chose Kodak for his first job after graduating from Rensselaer Poly Tech because of all the laboratory resources the company had. He experimented with many parts and pieces of equipment, and to make a long story short came up with a large box like gadget that could capture a photographic image without the use of film, paper, or subsequent development. This technology was kept under wraps for years until Kodak entered the digital world. Steve had the foresight to obtain patent rights for his work, and those patents subsequently gave the company legal rights as to how that technology would be used. Steve Sasson's story is an amazing case study of how the arrival of a new technology can affect the future of a company and its rivals. His presentations are in high demand among the best business schools internationally. Digital technology has changed just about everything we do world-wide; and to think the original concept happened in our own back yard.
